



The New Year of the Church started last week a new liturgical year with new lectionaries. We also had our financial audit of the parish looking over our parishes situation in the last 12 months.

1. There were lots of questions about significant increases and decreases of annual line amounts both on the income and expenditure lines of the accounts, as would be expected from an audit process.

The increases in income are of course explained by all your work on re-engaging our parishioners, the increased mass counts and the attention parishioners have paid to the 3 financial messages. The significant decreases on some expenditure lines especially in Altar and Liturgical and Heating and Lighting are of course down to controlling expenditure. We spoke about Fr Rob's implementation of the Purchase order system and going out for 3 quotes, and other changes ...all part of the usual processes that should be in place in every parish.

We spent some time talking about the significant spend within the different building and repairs lines. We spoke about our thoughts about the value for money issue with the St J ceiling repair, the long delayed repair of the heating system at St Marys, plus the catch up on mandatory compliance and additional charges through doing essential work after it should have been done. We spoke about the significant increase in the headcount costs due to the 2 redundancies and the 1 termination of employment agreement. And the reasons for these, and the process that we went through in getting agreement to these actions

I was very clear that because we are still in discussion with the Trustees about the accountability of the deficit built up during the six year previous to Fr Rob's arrival in Sept 23, I had not signed off the annual accounts.

That was accepted and recorded after a brief discussion.

Charles, who works for diocesan finance dept. was very supportive and commended us to the auditor on how much turn around has been achieved here and how this parish is now an example of how things should be done.

Charles view, after the end of the work yesterday, was that he didn't think we should have any concerns at all: from his point of view he thought St Joseph's accounts and systems were top quality. He asked me to say how impressive this is from where we were 12 months ago.

So a good result due to the response of you all. A special thank you to Sheila Wade, Marianne and Debbie and in her absence Davina, for all their work this past year in helping this parish achieve this result

If you are able to help please bring a paint brush and roller. 9am Saturday morning onwards. I am hoping to be able to use it on Christmas Eve after the evening mass but I need your help.

Contactless giving. Apologies the machines in our Churches for contactless giving have not been working for the last month or so. After investigating we have at least got to the source of the problem which is not something that we can fix ourselves I am hoping to have this rectified by Christmas. I the meantime apologies for the inconvenience but if in the interim you could consider a standing order or cash. Unfortunately because of the problem our income was down quite significantly last month.

#### We can still defeat assisted suicide!

Thank you to all of you who filled in one of our postcards, emailed our MP to encourage her to vote against the bill.

There is a clear path toward the assisted suicide Bill being defeated at Third Reading. Early analysis shows that at least 36 MPs supported the Bill but have concerns that mean they may vote NO at later stages. Just 28 MPs switching their stance to NO would ensure it is defeated at Third Reading. We need MPs to know that their constituents want them to vote NO at Third Reading.
